

Chevron Double Crochet Scarf

Materials: Lion Brand Wool Ease yarn: 2 skeins Avocado (MC), 1 skein Fisherman (CC), I hook

Size: approx. 6 1/2" x 61"

Abbreviations:

ch-chain

dc-double crochet

sc-single crochet

sk-skip

tch-turning chain

Instructions:

With MC ch. 23 loosely

Row 1 (RIGHT SIDE): dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each of next 8 chs, 3 dc in next ch (this is your hill), dc in each of next 10 chs, ch 2 or 3, turn.

Optional: On next rows, work through back loops only for a ridged effect.

Row 2 (pattern stitch): sk 1 dc (do not put first stitch in the base of your turning chain, do not put it in the next st, but in the next one), dc in each of next 9 dc, 3 dc in next dc (which is the middle dc of the first hill on the previous row), dc in each of next 9 dc, sk 1 dc, dc in top ch of tch, ch 2 or 3, turn.

Continue established pattern of Row 2, changing colors as follows. You can cut yarn or carry it up when you change color.

Row 1-9: MC (both two or three chevron pattern)

For two chevron pattern work:

Rows 10-11: CC

Rows 12-13: MC

Rows 14-15: CC (about 9" or so at this point)

Rows 16-82: MC (middle portion of scarf)

Rows 83-84: CC

Rows 85-86: MC

Rows 87-88: CC

Rows 89-97: MC (9 rows)

For three chevron pattern work:

Rows 10-11: CC

Rows 12-13: MC

Rows 14-15: CC

Rows 16-17: MC

Rows 18-19: CC (scarf will measure about 12" or so at this point)

Rows 20-78: MC (this is the middle portion of the scarf)

Rows 79-80: CC

Rows 81-82: MC

Rows 83-84: CC

Rows 85-86: MC

Rows 87-88: CC

Rows 89-97: MC (9 rows)

Fasten off.

Border: on right side, ch1, sc around working (sc, ch 1, sc) in corners (or whatever it takes to make it lie flat) and 2 sc around each dc post along sides. For foundation row work as for ripple – sk 2 at valley and 3 sc in the 2 chains at the hill
