

## Striped Double Crochet Scarf

**Materials:** I hook, Lion Brand Wool-Ease: 2 skeins Avocado (MC) and 1 skein Fisherman (CC)

**Possible color substitutes:** Colors that can be worn by either gender such as red, white and blue, dark greens, tans, browns, greys, and fisherman. No pinks or pastels.

**Size:** approx. 7" x 61"

**Instructions:**

With MC, chain 24

**Row 1:** double crochet in 4th chain from hook and in each chain across (22 double crochet), chain 3, turn

**Row 2-6:** double crochet in each stitch across, changing to CC at end of row 6, (*You can carry up unused color*), chain 3, turn. (about 3" in length completed. Don't worry if it is a little bit more or less.)

To change color work stitch to last step, finish stitch with new color. Do not knot. You will weave strands in later.

**Rows 7-8:** with CC, double crochet in each stitch across, changing to MC at end of row 8, chain 3, turn.

Continue established pattern, changing colors as follows. 22 stitches on every row.

**Rows 9-10:** MC

**Rows 11-12:** CC

**Rows 13 -14:** MC

**Rows 15- 16:** CC, cut CC at end of row 16, at least 6" from end and join MC (You should now have 3 stripes of your CC color.)

Rows 1 to 16 measure about 9".

**Rows 17-95:** MC (this is the middle section of one color)

**Rows 96-97:** CC

**Rows 98-99:** MC

**Rows 100-101:** CC

**Rows 102-103:** MC

**Rows 104-105:** CC

You should have 3 stripes of your CC color.

**Rows 106-111:** MC

Do not finish off.

**Edging:** continuing in MC, on right side, single crochet around. In corners choose the option below which keeps your corner flat.

*Corner Options:*

A - 3 single crochet in each corner

B - (single crochet, chain 1, single crochet)

C - (single crochet, chain 2, single crochet)

D - (2 single crochet, chain 2, 2 single crochet)

E - (2 single crochet, chain 1, 2 single crochet)

F - (single crochet, half double crochet, single crochet)

G - (single crochet, chain 1, single crochet, chain 1, single crochet)

If you carried your new color up, be sure to catch those strands in your edging so they will be hidden.

Finish off and sew in ends, working a few inches in one direction, then down and back in the other direction.
