

Quick Scarf

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This is an open weave pattern. Pretty, but not as warm as a close stitched one.

Material: L hook, Lion Brand Vanna's Choice worsted weight Dusty Blue acrylic yarn, about 4 ounces.

Note: I also made one with an N hook, and about 5 ounces Lion Brand Jiffy brushed acrylic yarn (just short of 2 skeins) Size was 6" x 63"



Size: 5" x 53"

Pattern is a multiple of 3 + 2

V stitch: (dc, ch 1, dc) in same stitch

DC Decrease: (worked over two stitches) yo, insert hook into dc, yo, pull through stitch (3 lps on hk), yo, pull through 2 lps (2 loops on hk), At this point you are one step away from completing a regular dc, do not finish the dc but instead... yo, insert hook into next stitch, yo, pull through stitch (4 lps on hk), yo, pull through 2 lps (3 lps on hk), yo, pull through all 3 lps

Ch 143 (For a vertical scarf, ch 29 for 9 V's)

Row 1: dc in 4th ch from hk, dc in ea ch across, ch 2, turn. (141 dc)

Row 2: (dc, ch 1, dc) in next dc, *sk next 2 dc, (dc, ch 1, dc) in next st; rep from * across, end dc in top of turning ch; ch 2, turn. (47 V's)

Row 3: *DC decrease, ch 2, rep from * across, to last three stitches, end dc decrease, dc in top of turning ch, ch 2, turn. (47 decreases)

Row 4: *dc in top of dc decrease, 2 dc in ch-2 sp, rep from * across to last two stitches, end dc in top of last dc decrease, dc in top of turning ch, ch 2, turn. (141 dc)

Rows 5 – 7: repeat rows 2-4 once then finish off

For a vertical scarf, repeat rows 2-4 until you have the desired length

Border: sc around, working 3 (or more) sc in corners – whatever you need for work to lie flat. Sometimes I will use a (sc, ch 2, sc) as the chain allows a bit of flexibility.
