

Single Crochet Striped Scarf

Materials: I hook, Lion Brand Wool-Ease worsted weight yarn: 6 ozs. Main Color (MC), 3 ozs Contrasting Color (CC) (sample uses Navy and Grey Heather)

Possible color substitutes: Colors that can be worn by either gender such as red, white and blue, dark greens, tans, browns, greys, and fisherman. No pinks or pastels.

Size: approx. 7" x 67"

Pattern Abbreviations:

ch = chain
hk = hook
ea = each
sc = single crochet
st = stitch
sl st = slip stitch

Instructions:

With MC, ch 24

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from hk and in ea ch across (23 sc), ch 1, turn

Row 2-12: sc in ea st across, changing to CC at end of row 12 (you do not need to cut yarn, you will pick it up when you need it again), ch 1, turn. You will have about 3" in length completed. Don't worry if it is a little more or less.

To change color work st to last step, finish st with new color. Do not knot strands together.

Rows 13-16: with CC, sc in ea st across, at end of row 16 pick up MC and finish last stitch with that color, ch 1, turn.

Continue established pattern, changing colors as follows. 23 stitches on every row.

Rows 17-20: MC

Rows 21-24: CC

Rows 25-28: MC

Rows 29-32: CC

leaving at least 6", cut CC at end of row 32, since you won't need it again for a while, and finish last stitch with MC. (3 stripes of your CC color)

Rows 33-220: MC

Rows 221-224: CC

Rows 225-228: MC

Rows 229-232: CC

Rows 233-236: MC

Rows 237-240: CC

Rows 241-252: MC, do not finish off

You should have 3 stripes of your CC color. You should also be on your right side.



Edging: continuing in MC, sc around entire scarf, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in corners. If you carried your new color up, be sure to catch those strands in your edging so they will be hidden.

Finish off and sew in ends, working a few inches in one direction, then down and back in the other direction.
