

## SC Scarf for Veterans

Materials: I hook, 6 ozs. MC, about 1 1/2 ozs CC

*Pictured: Lion Brand Wool-Ease worsted wt Navy, Grey Heather*

Color suggestions: Any color that can be worn by either gender; red, white and blue; greens such as olive, hunter or sage green; tans and browns; dark reds like claret, burgundy, maroon; blues like wedgewood, true blue, royal blue, navy blue; grey; camouflage variegated. These colors can be matched with a cream, white, or buff.

Size: approx. 7" x 67"

Instructions:

With MC, ch 24

Row 1: sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> chain from hook and in ea ch across (23 sc), ch 1, turn

Row 2-12: sc in ea st across, changing to CC at end of row 12 (you do not need to cut yarn, you will pick it up when you need it again), ch 1, turn. You will have about 3" in length completed. Don't worry if it is a little more or less.

To change color work st to last step, finish st with new color. Do not knot strands together.

Rows 13-16: with CC, sc in ea st across, at end of row 16 pick up MC and finish last stitch with that color, ch 1, turn.

Continue established pattern, changing colors as follows. 23 stitches on every row.

Rows 17-20: MC

Rows 21-24: CC

Rows 25 -28: MC

Rows 29-32: CC, cut CC at end of row 32 at least 6" from end since you won't need it again for a while, and finish last stitch with MC. (3 stripes of your CC color)

Rows 33-220: MC

Rows 221-224: CC

Rows 225-228: MC

Rows 229-232: CC

Rows 233-236: MC

Rows 237-240: CC

Rows 241-252: MC, do not finish off

You should have 3 stripes of your CC color. You should also be on your right side.

Border: continuing with MC sc in first st and in ea st across to last st, in last stitch work (sc, ch 2, sc), sc along all sides, adjusting stitches to keep piece flat as you work. If you carried your new color up, be sure to catch those strands in your border so they will be hidden. In corners work (sc, ch 2, sc). When you get back to the first stitch of Row 252 work (sc, ch 2) and join to first sc of that row. Finish off and sew in ends.
