

Breast Cancer Ribbon Scarf quick reference guide

This scarf uses the filet breast cancer ribbon pattern in my afghan. It just has fewer dc on either side.

Materials:

H hook

6 ozs worsted weight pink yarn

Note: pic uses Mary Maxim Best Value light pink which is discontinued. Possible alternatives might be Caron Natura Soft Pink, Mary Maxim Starlette Pale Petal Pink or Red Heart Soft Pink



Size: 7 1/2" x however long you want
Rows 1-23 = 12"

Hole = (dc, ch 1)

Note: ch 2 or 3 and turn at the end of each row, totals INCLUDE the tch. Ea row has 27dc

Instructions:

Ch 29

Row 1: dc in 4th chain from hook and across (27dc this and every row)

Row 2: dc across

Row 3: 2 dc, ch 1, sk 1, 21 dc, ch 1, sk 1, 2 dc

Row 4: 2 dc, 2 holes, 17 dc, 2 holes, 2 dc

Row 5: 2 dc, 3 holes, 13 dc, 3 holes, 2 dc

Row 6: 2 dc, 4 holes, 9 dc, 4 holes, 2 dc

Row 7: 2 dc, 5 holes, 5 dc, 5 holes, 2 dc

Row 8: 4 dc, 10 holes, 4 dc

Row 9: 6 dc, 8 holes, 6 dc

Row 10: 8 dc, 6 holes, 8 dc

Row 11: 6 dc, 8 holes, 6 dc

Row 12: 4 dc, 10 holes, 4 dc

Row 13: 4 dc, 4 holes, 5 dc, 4 holes, 4 dc

Row 14: 4 dc, 3 holes, 9 dc, 3 holes, 4 dc

Row 15-17: repeat Row 14

Row 18: 4 dc, 4 holes, 5 dc, 4 holes, 4 dc

Row 19: 6 dc, 8 holes, 6 dc

Row 20: 8 dc, 6 holes, 8 dc

Row 21: 10 dc, 4 holes, 10 dc

Row 22: dc in ea dc and in ea ch-1 sp across

Rows 23-25: dc in ea dc across, do not finish off.

Now you can choose how to continue. You can make several ribbons, one after the other until your scarf is long enough. To do that just repeat rows 3—25 to desired size, ending at row 23 on last ribbon.

If you want your ribbon to look the same after you wrap your scarf around your neck, then you may want to work the second half in reverse. Having done that myself, I found there was a bulge in the center section before the reverse ribbons began. To assist with the bulging you might want to work those rows a bit tighter or loosen up on your filet rows or perhaps use a smaller hook at that point, whatever helps with this problem.

Here are the reverse instructions—which in this case are actually just going backwards. (Note that is not always the case when reversing a pattern)

Row 1: 10 dc, 4 holes, 10 dc
Row 2: 8 dc, 6 holes, 8 dc
Row 3: 6 dc, 8 holes, 6 dc
Row 4: 4 dc, 4 holes, 5 dc, 4 holes, 4 dc
Row 5: 4 dc, 3 holes, 9 dc, 3 holes, 4 dc
Row 6-8: repeat Row 5
Row 9: 4 dc, 4 holes, 5 dc, 4 holes, 4 dc
Row 10: 4 dc, 10 holes, 4 dc
Row 11: 6 dc, 8 holes, 6 dc
Row 12: 8 dc, 6 holes, 8 dc
Row 13: 6 dc, 8 holes, 6 dc
Row 14: 4 dc, 10 holes, 4 dc
Row 15: 2 dc, 5 holes, 5 dc, 5 holes, 2 dc
Row 16: 2 dc, 4 holes, 9 dc, 4 holes, 2 dc
Row 17: 2 dc, 3 holes, 13 dc, 3 holes, 2 dc
Row 18: 2 dc, 2 holes, 17 dc, 2 holes, 2 dc
Row 19: 2 dc, ch 1, sk 1, 21 dc, ch 1, sk 1, 2 dc
Row 20: dc in ea dc and in ea ch-1 sp across
Rows 21-23: dc in ea dc across

Can be used to make a strip afghan as well.

Note: Rows 5-8 corrected 12-2014
